June 13-19

Week 1 AM: Little Hands Cooking Camp

Edible art is art too! Come make fun things to eat while exploring measuring and other cooking techniques. From placemats and table settings to breakfast sculptures made of clay and salad potions, let's eat, stir, and sift our way through the week!

Week 1 PM: Silly Scientist

Have you ever made a volcano erupt, melted ice to make a painting, or made slime in a laboratory? Here is your chance! We'll blend art and science in a camp that encourages experimentation, problem solving, and the excitement of discovery.

June 20-23

Week 2 AM : Magical, Musical Camp

Do you love magic potions or wearing wings? Do you want to sing songs about dragons and make instruments that really sing? Have you ever wanted to turn a grown-up into a frog? Well, this is the camp full of music and magic where we'll explore all types of musical art.

Week 2 PM : Nature Explorers

Come join us as we explore our outside world! We will create bug jars and binoculars, make flower paper, visit the ducks, and investigate the world in which we live; a perfect summer camp for the young explorer.

June 27-30

Week 3 AM : De Bajo del Mar (Under the Sea)

Explore the world under the sea while learning Spanish! From sea creatures and sunken ships to mermaids and tidal waves, we'll travel the seven seas while learning Spanish vocabulary and songs. Art and language combine for a wild, wet adventure.

Week 3 PM : Lines and Shapes, Squiggles and Paint

Drip, drop, splat and squish! Explore the world through paint! We'll turn everyday objects into paint brushes, make prints, and spray and splatter paint for colorful, messy fun. Dress for the mess!

July 5-8

Week 4 AM : Fantasy Camp

Did you ever wish you had wings or a magical cape that could help you soar the skies? In this camp we mix fairy tales, magical stories and our own imaginations to inspire fantastical creations and dramatic play. We'll enter a world with fairies, dragons and unicorns, where imagination is our only limit.

Week 4 PM : Un-Birthday Party

Celebrate your Un-Birthday all week! We'll make party hats, art cakes, and other festive decorations. And we'll definitely get to make birthday wishes! The camp ends with an Un-Birthday party with treats and presents we make ourselves. Happy birthday to me, happy birthday to me...



July 11-14

Week 5 AM : Music Around the World

Travel the world through music. We'll make instruments, learn songs, and get our bodies moving to world music. The class ends with a short performance by students!

Week 5 PM : Sing, Dance, and Play all Day!

Join us as we dance and dance! Do you love to sing and move your body to music? Then this is the camp for you! In this camp we'll dance together, create movement-based art, and sing along to new songs and old favorites. The week will end in a special performance for families!

Weekly Summer Camps (ages 3-6)

July 18-21

Week 6 AM: Murals Big and Small

Do you ever feel like paper isn't big enough for your brush? Do you wonder how artists make really large paintings? In this camp, you'll design and paint on giant surfaces and explore ways of creating community art, as well as individual smaller-scale murals. Dress to get messy! This camp will involve lots of paint!

Week 6 PM: Puppet Party

Make puppets big and small. Use sticks, cloth, and shadows to create a variety of puppets, then experiment with story-telling and dramatic play. Camp ends with our own Puppet Party puppet show!

July 25-28

Week 7 AM : Farm in the City

Come along with us as we bring the farm to the city, where we plant and tend and find ways to do things ourselves! We'll get to dig through dirt and plant in our UAA city gardens, and learn about ways that we can help take care of our Earth.

Week 7 PM: Play With Paint

Drip, drop, splat and squish! Explore the world through paint! We'll turn everyday objects into paint brushes, make prints and spray and splatter paint for colorful, messy fun. Dress for the mess.



August 1-4

Week 8 AM : Art Parade

We'll create colorful costumes, masks, noise-makers, and props for parades around the building and our neighborhood! We'll end the camp with a grand finale parade for families and showcase all our fabulous artistic creations.

Week 8 PM : Shake, Rattle, and Roll

A camp for the busy preschooler who wants to explore motion and movement through art: create boats that sail, planes that soar, and cars that roll. Move your body with songs, games, and art activities that keep us movin' and groovin'.

August 8-11

Week 9 AM : Hola! the Explorer

Yes, this is the Spanish camp where you get to be Dora the explorer and Diego! We will create bug jars and binoculars, make handmade paper, and investigate the world in which we live; a perfect summer camp for the young explorer.

Week 9 PM : Glow in the Dark Sculptures

Come build sculptures of all shapes and sizes; then paint them so they glow in the dark! We'll use Styrofoam, boxes, clay, wood, and even... legos! This week will end with a guided tour for families through our UAA sculpture park.



Weekly Summer Camps (ages 6-14)

June 13-19

Week 1 AM: Masks, Movement, and Story

Come explore expression in this unique camp, where we'll use masks and movement to tell stories. Experience how imagination and a mask can make the impossible possible and make movement and story-telling fun even for the shy! Dress for the mess!

Week 1 PM: Arte à la Carte

Do you love all sorts of different kinds of art? Are you having trouble deciding which camps to sign up for? Why not come to our Arte à la Carte! Each day will bring you a different art technique and experience. Students will have an opportunity to voice their choices, camps will vary, but may include painting, drawing, simple print-making, 3-D sculpture (wood, clay, wire), fabric arts, and more! Come dabble as we creative types explore what suits your fancy!

June 20-23

Week 2 AM : African Drumming and Dancing

Over the course of his week students will be encouraged to participate in the discovery of West African drumming, dance, and storytelling. West African culture is rich with symbols, rituals, conflict, history, and opportunity. The metaphor of West African music and dance allows students to experience the culture in a rhythmic and physical realm. Students will experience and learn traditional songs and dances.

Week 2 PM : Fabric Reconstruct

Sew, print, and cut to redesign and create new, funky clothing. Face challenges like project runway and see if you can master the great design! We'll use sewing machines, paint, and of course the famous bedazzler to add a little bling.

June 27-30

Week 3 AM : Drawing our World

Get your sketch books, it's time to draw! In this camp we will explore our neighborhood with a pencil, charcoal, and paper. Each day will include a walking field trip to a new part of town where we use our discoveries to inspire our artistic expression. Bring a water bottle and walking shoes!

Week 3 PM : Paint it, Picasso!

Have you ever wanted to create a masterpiece? In this camp we will learn the techniques behind Picassos' art including color theory, shading, and composition. Each participant will work on their own canvas. We will celebrate our hard work with a "gallery opening" for our family and friends!



July 5-8

Week 4 AM : Make Your own Music Video

Get behind or in front of that video camera! We'll make a song or create a music video to one that already exists! Write the script for the movie. Tell a story through movement. We'll learn about filming, acting, and editing. Then we'll show off our final video on YouTube!

Week 4 PM : Digital Darkroom

Have you ever wanted to work for National Geographic? If so, this camp is for you! With camera in hand, we will explore out in the neighborhood while learning about photo composition and technique.

Weekly Summer Camps (ages 6-14)



July 11-14

Week 5 AM : Peter and the Wolf

Listen to the famous Russian folk tale told through orchestral instruments and explore the idea of story-telling through music. Students will experiment with instrument design and make their own instruments using everyday household items such as milk jugs, and toilet paper rolls.

Week 5 PM : Funkiture

This is the building class which turns ordinary furniture upside down. Turn drawers into tables or tables into chairs. Build a bookcase with wheels, and much, much more!

July 18-21

Week 6 AM: Printmaking

In this class you will explore the world of printmaking, from mono-prints to etching. We supply the printing press and lots of fun!!!

Week 6 PM: Songwriting Camp

Come rock it out UAA style! in this camp we'll have fun writing and creating our own music: words, sounds, and melodies with a local musician and song writer. We may even have the opportunity to record and/or perform our creations!

July 25-28

Week 7 AM : Make your own Music Video

Get behind or in front of that video camera! We'll make a song or create a music video to one that already exists! Write the script for the movie. Tell a story through movement. We'll learn about filming, acting, and editing. Then we'll show off our final video on YouTube!

Week 7 PM: Dream, Design, and Build!

Design and construct your own models: houses, schools, even entire cities! we'll explore the questions of who, what, where, and how to get our creative minds thinking of form and function. There is nothing that a few nails, a lot of hot glue, and inventive minds can't create.

August 1-4

Week 8 AM : Puppetry and the Art of Storytelling

Students will learn the art of puppetry and mask design across various cultures and time periods around the world. Each day we will create new puppets and masks using the framework of the culture we discussed earlier that day. Emphasis will be placed on exploring facial expressions of the puppetmask and the art of motion and how it influences the storytelling experience.

Week 8 PM : Mural Camp

Be your own Diego Rivera, working alongside local mural artists to design and paint on a giant wall with an amazing local artist; the wall will be for all to see everyday at UAA! Artists get messy, that's what we do-so dress to paint, paint paint!

August 8-11

Week 9 AM : Art Around the World

From folk art in Sweden to Aboriginal art in Australia, get ready to travel the world this summer and discover new techniques and cultures through art! We'll explore painting, drawing, sculpting, and story-telling from different countries around the world. Adventure is waiting!

Week 9 PM : Mosaic Madness

Let's break some tiles with hammers and throw dishes on the ground! Mosaic puzzles are usually made with small pieces of tile and grout. Anyone can do it! In this class you will learn all the basics of mosaic making to create birdhouses, sculptures, mirrors, and more.

What is KidPower?

KidPower is a vibrant, bilingual program that is provided for K-8 youth to ensure a structured, supportive environment that helps to maintain social, academic, and behavioral consistency during the summer months and further empowers youth as leaders and peer mentors during the academic year.

KidPower is a half-day (with optional after-care) summer enrichment program that works to empower children in grades K-8. KidPower fuses exciting art and leadership curriculum to create a fun and engaging approach to overall positive youth development and leadership skills building. Our goal is to provide a fun summer full of field trips, art classes, swimming, performances, urban farming, and more.



Overall Goals of KidPower

Meet the holistic needs of under-served neighborhood families and children who because of income, language barriers, and/or transportation issues would not be able to access educational opportunities during the summer.

1. Enrich social and emotional lives through creative arts experiences that support strong and productive relationships within families to aid in the growth and development of children.
2. Bring together the rich diversity of neighborhood children, families, and community to facilitate positive connections and appreciation of world cultures.
3. Establish a foundation for life-long learning through creative academic skill-building learning experiences that promote academic readiness.



In KidPower, youth participate in quality programming that consists of five primary components:

1. academic skills building
2. arts expression
3. arts integration
4. leadership development
5. community and family building

Parents are invited to join us 4 times during the summer to participate in art and leadership projects with their students at the end of the day. We also invite parents to join us for all field trips throughout the summer.



Our Hope

After the summer about 90% of KidPower youth will enroll in Urban Arts' After-school program where they are placed in groups as classroom leaders and mentors to further empower KidPower youth to acquire/apply leadership and developmental skills. KidPower youth assist classroom staff and artists during projects and are paired with new program participants for orientation.



Who Participates?

Everyone is encouraged to apply! In keeping with our mission we strive to serve the residents of South Minneapolis. Importance is placed on creating quality summer opportunities for all students regardless of means.
